4. Were there any stories you didn't like?

- 1: No
- 2: I don't know.
- 3: No not really
- 4: There was a bad idea, when Flemming got injured and had to go to hospital, then Frederikke took the television with her in the car, that doesn't work, because you need to plug it in, and there is no plug in the car. I think that is a bit weird. And she likes her television more than her kids, I think that is a bit shite.

5. Could you imagine being friends with someone from a story? If yes, with whom and why?

- 1: Freja (from their story) because she sounds fun and she likes football and I like football sometimes, and she also visits the riding school, like me.
- 2: I really don't know.
- 3: I could imagine becoming friends with Yusra, because we both like swimming.

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6. In fairy tales, animals, trees, everything is alive. There are also other worlds that you travel to, e.g. the sun, the moon, the fairy world. Do you think that's true?

- 1: Yes, in the stories. You can travel in the stories. Like if you live in a completely normal city, and then you meet someone who puts you inside a time machine and you end up in Smurf Land, and then it is about your struggle to get out and back home.
- 2: No.
- 3: No, but we have people all over the world, then it had to be on another planet, but there is no oxygen on the other planets, so then it would have to be in a different galaxy, but it seems a bit unreal. But I can imagine it in my head.

7. Would you recommend that schools include storytelling projects like ours in their normal school day?

- 1: To learn about humanity is possible through stories and then the world can be saved. Stoytelling can motivate children to invent something new. First to listen to stories to open my imagination.
- 2: Important! Yes! We learnt to listen well and invent things in our heads and now I can invent stories.
- 3: Yes, because all should be the same and this is very good to get imagination.
- 4: Yes, because the children got imagination and also did not have to sit all the time and have to write.
- 5: Most certainly because: 1. really wonderful, 2. funny, 3. one learns to work in a group.
- 6: Oh yes, this would be wonderful. One can imagine things in ones head and not have all the same subjects every day.
- 7: Yes, because one can invent stories much better and it helps to speak the language better.
- 8: Yes, because some children don't like going to school. Such a project motivates them to like it better.
